


From the President:

On Wednesday, May 15, 2024, at 10 a.m. until noon, LIRA will hold its Annual Meeting in the Jacqueline and Edward Moloney Hall (UCC-260) at University Crossing. Membership Renewal 2024 - 2025

LIRA membership dues are \$145 (\$240 for couples) for the year July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025, and are due by August 15, 2024. A portion of the dues (\$100 for an individual and \$150 for a couple) is tax deductible. The University will send each member a receipt for tax purposes; the remaining portion of the dues is returned to LIRA for operational expenses.

A convenient payment method is by credit card on the <u>LIRA website</u>. Click "Join LIRA" on the left side menu and then click "Join or renew online." You will receive an immediate acknowledgement and a receipt after filling out the form.

If you would rather pay by check, use the LIRA renewal form available on the LIRA website. Every member must complete a form; both members of a couple must complete a form. Send the form(s) and check to the Alumni Office, as stated on the renewal form, by August 15, 2024. Dues checks will be accepted at the Convocation in September **by exception only.**

LIRA 2024 Summer Intersession Course/Trip Descriptions

Mozart - His Life and Music

Wednesdays, June 5 and June 12 10:00 a.m. – noon University Suites Rm. 106 and on Zoom

In two sessions, we will complete the presentation of Robert Greenberg's lectures on Mozart's life. His courses on classical music for the Teaching Company are always informative, filled with enthusiasm, and frequently irreverent. This Mozart biography is no exception, and these final four talks are sprinkled with examples of his mature music.

You don't need to have heard lectures 1-4. Just know that Mozart was an amazing child prodigy at performing and composing, and that he was toured all over Europe by his ambitious father. The story resumes in 1779, when he was 23 years old. In his final lecture, Prof. Greenberg goes into the theories about Mozart's tragic death at 35, at the peak of his creative power. We won't add much to Greenberg's lectures, but there will be a little time for discussion, and some extra musical examples, perhaps.

Andres Institute of Art

The Andres Institute of Art was founded in 1998 by Paul Andres and John Weidman. It hosted the first International Annual Bridges and Connections Sculpture Symposium in 1999. The 140 acres has 12 miles of trails, with 100 sculptures by artists from 50 countries on permanent display along the trails. The art and trails are open and available to the public every day, for free. A former ski resort, the Andres Institute is a bit steep; be prepared.

Eustis Estates

Friday, July 19 10:00 a.m. - noon Trip; Milton, MA

Join other LIRA members for a self-guided tour of the Eustis Estate in Milton MA. The mansion was built in 1878 and is a rare surviving example of late 19th-century architecture. Both the buildings and grounds are now property of the Historic New England collection of properties. The surrounding eighty acres of picturesque landscape are at the base of the Blue Hills Reservation and are just perfect for a leisurely stroll to admire the beautiful brick and stone facade and other details of the mansion from a distance.

The indoor self-guided tour experience is designed to allow visitors to move freely throughout the house, using touch screens to learn more about the history of the family, architecture, and decoration. Guides are able to answer questions. An elevator is available for access to the second floor.

Bring a blanket, chairs, and a picnic lunch if you'd like to spend some time after touring the home. Carpools will be encouraged for this activity; the distance from Hannaford's lot in Chelmsford to Eustis Estate in Milton is approximately 42 miles, just under one hour driving time. Meet at Hannaford's at 9:00 a.m. if interested in carpooling. Cost is \$17 for seniors, pay at entrance.
