



Honors by Design helps students track their E1's and other milestones, earning badges along the way that they can post to their LinkedIn profile.





We are weeks away from registering for classes for the spring semester. Before registration opens for honors students on October 28, you will may to meet with your

Honors Specialist to discuss your honors pathway so as to receive help as you consider which honors courses to enroll in to satisfy your H1-H8 requirements.

#### WHAT THE H?

There are a total of eight Honors College requirements, otherwise known as the "H's," that students must complete during their time at UMass Lowell in order to graduate with Commonwealth Distinction in Honors.

Honors requirements are designed to overlay within a student's chosen degree pathway. These are not additional courses that students must take at UMass Lowell. Instead, they offer students the honors experience within their major.

For many honors students they will be at UMass Lowell for eight semesters, meaning that a one-H-a-semester pace will honors students have completing all of them in time. However, students can certainly take two or even three honors in courses one an honors semester, take during winter course or summer break (such as an honors study abroad), or go a semester without taking an

honors course. Also, if you transferred to UMass Lowell, you can waive up to two honors requirements, depending upon the number of credits you transferred. And, lastly, Honors Experiential Learning Opportunities, such as honors fellowships, can also satisfy an H.

Meet with your Honors Specialist to find out which path makes the most sense for you.







This coming spring semester, the Honors College will be taking students to the Azores, Portugal, Madrid, Spain; and London, England.

The Azores program will run during spring break. This is designed for juniors and seniors with an eye on their Honors Project/Thesis. This writing retreat combines slow travel and Honors Project writing workshops and time for reflection and the opportunity to break out of your routine. Also running during spring break, Exploring Madrid's Past & Present, takes students to Spain's vibrant and lively capital where they will explore the city and country's fascinating past along with its dynamic present.

London on the Stage: Theatre & Community will explore the city of London through the stage, where students will have the opportunity to explore the city's stellar theatre scene through a civic engagement lens. While a spring class, students will travel to London in May.
