Lesson Topic: Literary and Artistic Responses to Industrialization

Lesson Title: Introducing Transcendentalism and the Ideas of Thoreau

Grade Level: High School

Class Time: 45-60 minutes

<u>Objectives:</u> Students will listen to a reading of a picture book to hear the basic ideas written by Henry David Thoreau.

Materials: <u>Henry Hikes to Fitchburg</u> by D.B.Lewis

Procedure:

- 1. Introduce students to the basic concepts of Transcendentalism.
 - a. Individuality
 - b. Intuition
 - c. Nature
- 2. Read Henry <u>Hikes to Fitchburg</u> slowly, pointing out all the pictorial references to citizens of Concord and the surrounding areas.
- 3. When the book is finished, ask the students to write a journal response to the following prompt:
 - a. What does it mean to "stop for blackberries?"
 - b. How can we have "blackberry days" in this class or in the school?
